## World Cup anthem is Ricky business

**RICKY WILSON** and **FREDDIE FLINTOFF** are hoping to unite the country with a rousing England World Cup anthem.

But their re-working of **BONEY M's** disco tune *Rasputin* has threatened the peace in the **KAISER CHIEFS** frontman's house.

The Leeds rocker has been booted out of the bedroom by his fiancée Grace Zito after driving her mad with replays of the song, which praises star striker **HARRY KANE**.

In an exclusive chat, Ricky said: "Every time I played it I had to go off into the spare room because Grace didn't want to hear it any more."

"She said she couldn't sleep because it was going around and around in her head." Their



unofficial anthem, *Rasputin Rebooted*, which tells the story of the England captain rather than *Rasputin*, a Russian mystic who claimed to predict the future, was released yesterday and features the
